(Please allow them to do as much independently as possible!) **Make sure to pick a variety of types of questions from week to week.** ☺

- Predict what you think will happen next in your story.
- Write a short summary about what you read today.
- The main idea of today's reading was...
- This book reminds me of something in my life because...
- Write the characters and setting in your story.
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- From today's reading what were some nouns and verbs the author used? List at least three of each. (Noun- person, place, animal, or thing; Verb- action word)
- Describe the most interesting part of today's reading.
- During today's reading, I could make a connection to myself, the world, and another book. Explain your connection to each.
- What are three details from today's reading that support the main idea?
- Sequencing is the order things happen in a story. Write down the events your reading.
- Is your story fiction or nonfiction? How did you know?
- Compare how you and character from today's reading are alike.
- Give your reading today stars according to the rating you would give it. (1, 2, or 3 stars- 3 is the best.) Write a sentence explaining why you rated the book that way.
- What was your favorite part from today's reading?
- What is the author's purpose in today's reading? To inform? To explain? To persuade? Choose one and write what clues from the reading helped you Decide.
- In today's reading, what were some descriptive words the author used to help you get a better understanding of the story?
- Tell what happened in the beginning, middle, and end of your story.
- Write the main idea of your story and write two supporting details.
- Summarize what you read today.
